## Minister's Musings

Prayer is a central part of our faith. Prayer is miraculous, powerful, refreshing, and beautiful. Prayer can also be disappointing, difficult, confusing, and frustrating. People often ask and wonder if prayer works. Before we can answer that vital question, we need to consider what prayer is and is not. Prayer is your personal relationship with God. Prayer is our public expression of faith when we gather in Christ's name. Prayer is quiet reflection.

Prayer is not a vending machine where we go to get our desires fulfilled. Prayer is not bribing or manipulating God.

When I pray for others, I ask God to be with them so that they will feel God's presence and know God's peace.

When I pray for myself, I ask that God be with me and give me the strength to accept God's will and to go where the Spirit leads me. I ask that God mold me and reform me to be the person that God intends me to be.

Sometimes I don't know what to pray, so I just sit quietly and listen. During these quiet times I rarely hear the voice of God, but I often encounter God. I've found my quiet reflections are always followed with a sense of calm and contentment.

This is how I know that prayer works.

We should pray every day or even multiple times a day. Prayers can be as formal as saying the Lord's Prayer or as simple as just saying "Help."

I encourage you to pray. If this is a new practice for you, start out slowly. Prayer has a tendency to change those that pray more than it changes those for whom we pray.

Prayer works - in us.

### **Collaborative Events**

#### **August 6 Worship Service**

On Sunday, August 6, Gethsemane Lutheran Church will host members of Christ the King Lutheran Church and Messiah Lutheran Church for a collaborative worship service.

In addition to worship, we will have a small service project and a baking contest.

Our Service Project will be filling quart size zip lock bags with bottled water, fruit cups, protein crackers (e.g. cheese or peanut butter), breakfast bars (granola or other), wet naps, meat/cheese sticks, and other small (single serve) shelf stable snack items. GLC distribute these to the Manchester unsheltered population.

The Baking Contest will have three categories: cupcakes, cookies, brownies/bars. Bakers are asked to share if their recipe includes any of the common food allergies: dairy, eggs, tree nuts, peanuts, gluten, soy, or fish.

Upon arrival, each person will receive three tickets to use for voting on their favorite baked good(s). Service will begin at 9:30am in our Mary Martha room downstairs.

Worshippers, if able, are asked to bring some of the items needed for the snack packs. Additionally, we also hand out travel sized hygiene products (soap, shampoo, toothbrush/paste, feminine hygiene products, etc) if you'd like to bring any of those items as well or instead.
